Ultimately, they form over a thousand communities across countries. In spirit, they are an artists' village, a disparate yet deeply connected **family**.

INTER THEATRE's mission is to make these artists feel like **true neighbors**. Physical distance, national borders, and logistical barriers will not hinder collaboration, mutual support, and shared learning and creativity. By building connections, facilitating co-creation of content, and organizing joint workshops, networks, and exchanges, we aim to **transform** this disparate community into a **unified, sustainable cultural hub**.
